Starting a New Local Club

If you wish to start a new club, and there are 10 or more registered Republican women who wish to organize a permanent club, the following procedures should be followed. In states that do not register voters by Party, the potential members should be considered based on their commitment to Republican ideals and issues. The charter for a new club is issued by the NFRW and authorizes the operation of the club.

TIPS FOR ORGANIZING A NEW CLUB

1. The organizers should contact the state federation president or NFRW to obtain information and procedures for organizing a new club.
2. The organizers should introduce themselves to the County GOP Chairman, the State GOP Executive Committee and contact nearby club officers and members for information. They may have suggestions and may know of perspective members.
3. Make a list of prospective members. Call an informal meeting of prospective members to plan an organizational meeting.
4. Invite the state president or membership chair to attend the meeting and explain the benefits of NFRW membership and the advantages open to federated clubs.
5. At the Meeting:
 - Have the state president/membership chair speak.
 - Select a temporary chair and secretary to act until officers are elected.
 - Select a name for the club. In accordance with NFRW Bylaws:
 - The word “Republican” shall be included in the title of all local clubs. Local clubs shall not use the word “federation” in their titles, but may use the word “federated.”
 - Draft bylaws, using the sample bylaws provided by the NFRW.
 - Elect officers. They may serve only until the club is chartered or they may be elected to serve a full term as determined by the bylaws.
 - Select a day, time and place for the next meeting.

6. Submit a Letter of Intent to form a new club to the state federation. Include the name of the club, a roster of officers, club bylaws and a membership roster. Include a check to cover the per capita state and national federation dues, and the NFRW service charge of \$15.00.
7. The state federation will then submit the required application with per capita dues and service charge to NFRW.
8. The NFRW will issue the charter once all approvals are in place. The effective date of the charter is the date the club is approved by NFRW.
9. The charter will be sent to the state federation by the NFRW to be presented to the club.
